# 12th Regional Meeting of the South-East Europe Firearms Experts Network

The 12th Regional Meeting of the South-East Europe Firearms Experts Network (SEEFEN) took place in Novi Sad, Serbia, on 26-27 November 2019.

The meeting gathered investigators, prosecutors, customs officials, forensic experts and border police representatives from South East Europe, as well as experts from EUROPOL, FRONTEX, European Union (EU) Policy Cycle - EMPACT, UK'S National Ballistics Intelligence Service (NABIS), British National Crime Agency, Police Cooperation Convention for Southeast Europe (PCC SEE) Secretariat, EULEX and Guardia Civil to cooperate in countering serious, organized, and cross-border firearms related crime through a regional approach.

The meeting enabled a discussion on the newest modus operandi of firearms trafficking, modalities of cooperation in the framework of the PCC SEE, crypto currencies, intelligence assessment regarding sources of criminal use of firearms in the EU, best practices of operational, tactical and strategic intelligence (threat and risk) assessment and reporting on firearms related crimes, steps needed for a ballistic laboratory to be fully accredited in accordance with the ISO 17025 standard, methodologies of development and implementation of joint risk analysis between Border Police and Customs, special investigative measures, controlled delivery and simulated purchase.

SEEFEN is supported by the EU through EU Council Decision 2016/2356/CFSP. On 19 November 2018, this support was reinforced trough the new EU Council Decision (CFSP) 2018/1788 adopted in support of the SEESAC for the implementation of the Regional Roadmap on combating illicit arms trafficking in the Western Balkans. By supporting armed violence reduction and combatting illicit arms trafficking, SEEFEN meetings contribute to the achievement of SDG 16: Promote peaceful, just and inclusive societies and its target 16.4 that includes a significant reduction in illicit arms flows by 2030.

### Cookies on our web page

#### What is Cookie?

A cookie is a small piece of data sent from a website and stored in a user's web browse while a user is browsing a website. When the user browses the same website in the future, the data stored in the cookie can be retrieved by the website to notify the website of the user's previous activity

### How do we use cookies?

A visit to a this page could generate the following types of cookie.

#### Strictly necessary cookies

These cookies are essential in order to enable you to move around the website and use its features, such as accessing secure areas of the website. Without these cookies services you have asked for, like shopping baskets or e-billing, cannot be provided.

#### 2. Performance cookies

These cookies collect information about how visitors use a website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, and if they get error messages from web pages. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. It is only used to improve how a website works.

## 3. Functionality cookies

These cookies allow the website to remember choices you make (such as your user name, language or the region you are in) and provide enhanced, more personal features. For instance, a website may be able to provide you with local weather reports or traffic news by storing in a cookie the region in which you are currently located. These cookies can also be used to remember changes you have made to text size, fonts and other parts of web pages that you can customise. They may also be used to provide services you have asked for such as watching a video or commenting on a blog. The information these cookies collect may be anonymised and they cannot track your browsing activity on other websites.

## 4. Targeting and advertising cookies

These cookies are used to deliver adverts more relevant to you and your interests They are also used to limit the number of times you see an advertisement as well as help measure the effectiveness of the advertising campaign. They are usually placed by advertising networks with the website operator's permission. They remember that you have visited a website and this information is shared with other organisations such as advertisers. Quite often targeting or advertising cookies will be linked to site functionality provided by the other organisation.
