

#### Meeting Materials

Throughout South East Europe (SEE), National SALW Commissions and other relevant institutions have been set up in the past decade with a view of improving the coordination of the control of small arms and light weapons (SALW) and their ammunitions. Given that the issue of SALW proliferation has a strong regional character, SEESAC initiated regular Regional Meetings of National SALW Commissions, the first of which took place on 13 February 2014 in Belgrade, Serbla.



The aim of the meetings was to facilitate information exchange and knowledge sharing among the SALW Commissions, that way increasing their individual capacities, as well as the capacity of the region as a whole to implement SALW control measures.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the SALW Commissions of Albania, Croatia, Kosovo\*, Moldova, Montenegro and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. Representatives from UNDP Bosnia and Herzegovina, UNDP Croatia, UNDP Kosovo\* and UNDP Montenegro also took part and contributed significantly to the discussion.

The main goal of this preliminary meeting was to set the agenda for the upcoming meetings, during which perticipants would share their own work methods and structures, and learn from each others' experiences. Six meetings are planned for the three-year period (2014-2016) and the next one is tentatively set to take place in June-July 2014.

The regional meetings are an activity implemented under the EU Support of SEESAC Disarmament and Arms Control Activities in South East Europe (EUSAC) project, initiated through the Council Decision 2013/730/CPSP.





#### The 5th Executive Committee Meeting of the CASM **Programme Held**

The Executive Committee of the CASM Programme met for the 5th time on 9 May 2014 at the SEESAC office to review current work and future plans. At the 5th meeting, the Programme Management Unit informed the Executive Committee about the progress

With over 10 years of experience in the practical implementation of SALW control measures, SEESAC has successfully supported national and international stakeholders to reduce the threat posed by the widespread availability of SALW. Adopting a holistic approach to arms control SEESAC's interventions encompass the full spectrum of activities: from awareness raising and SALW collection campaigns, to stockpile management, surplus reduction and improved marking and tracing capabilities. SEESAC's focus on prevention also resulted in increasing work on disaster risk reduction supporting efforts to make countries more resilient.

Our unique capacity and experience in implementing multi-stakeholder regional interventions made SEESAC particularly adept at delivering transformational change. Since 2009, SEESAC has developed a growing portfolio of projects introducing a gender perspective into security sector reform. 
