

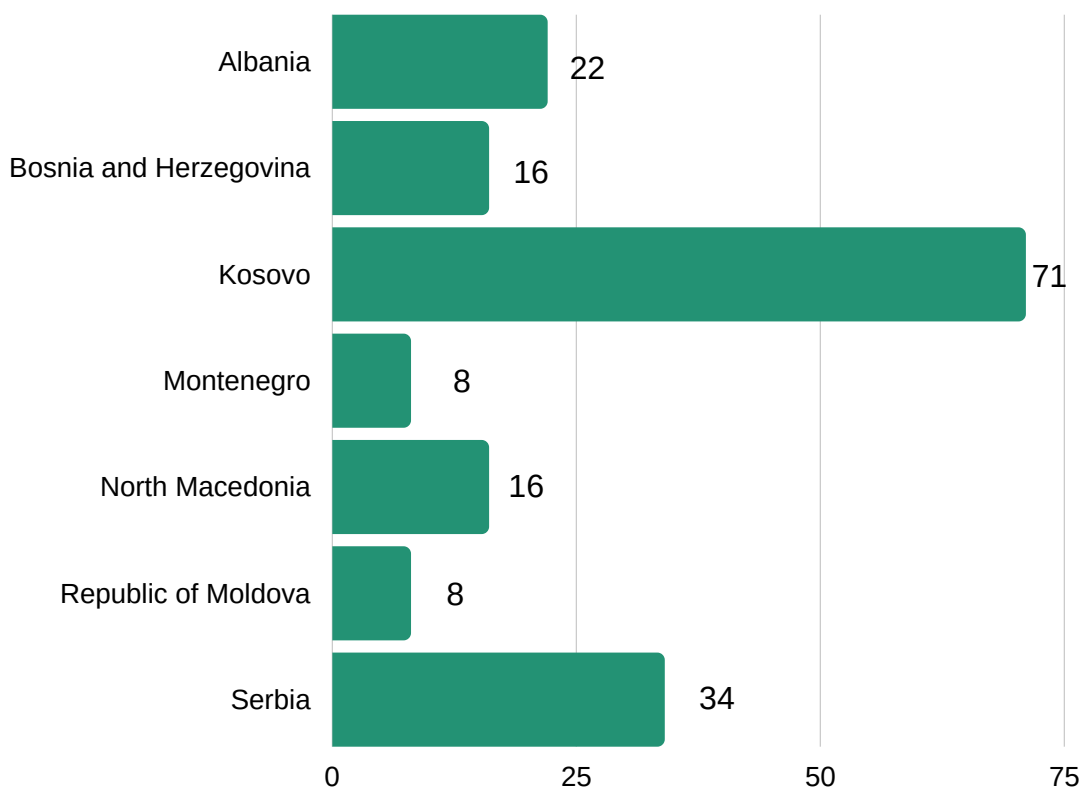

The information herein is extracted from the Armed Violence Monitoring Platform (AVMP) (<http://www.seesac.org/AVMP/>) showing the main data on the reported firearm-related incidents in South East Europe covering Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Republic of Moldova and Serbia, as collected from media reports, for the period from 1 to 30 September 2019.

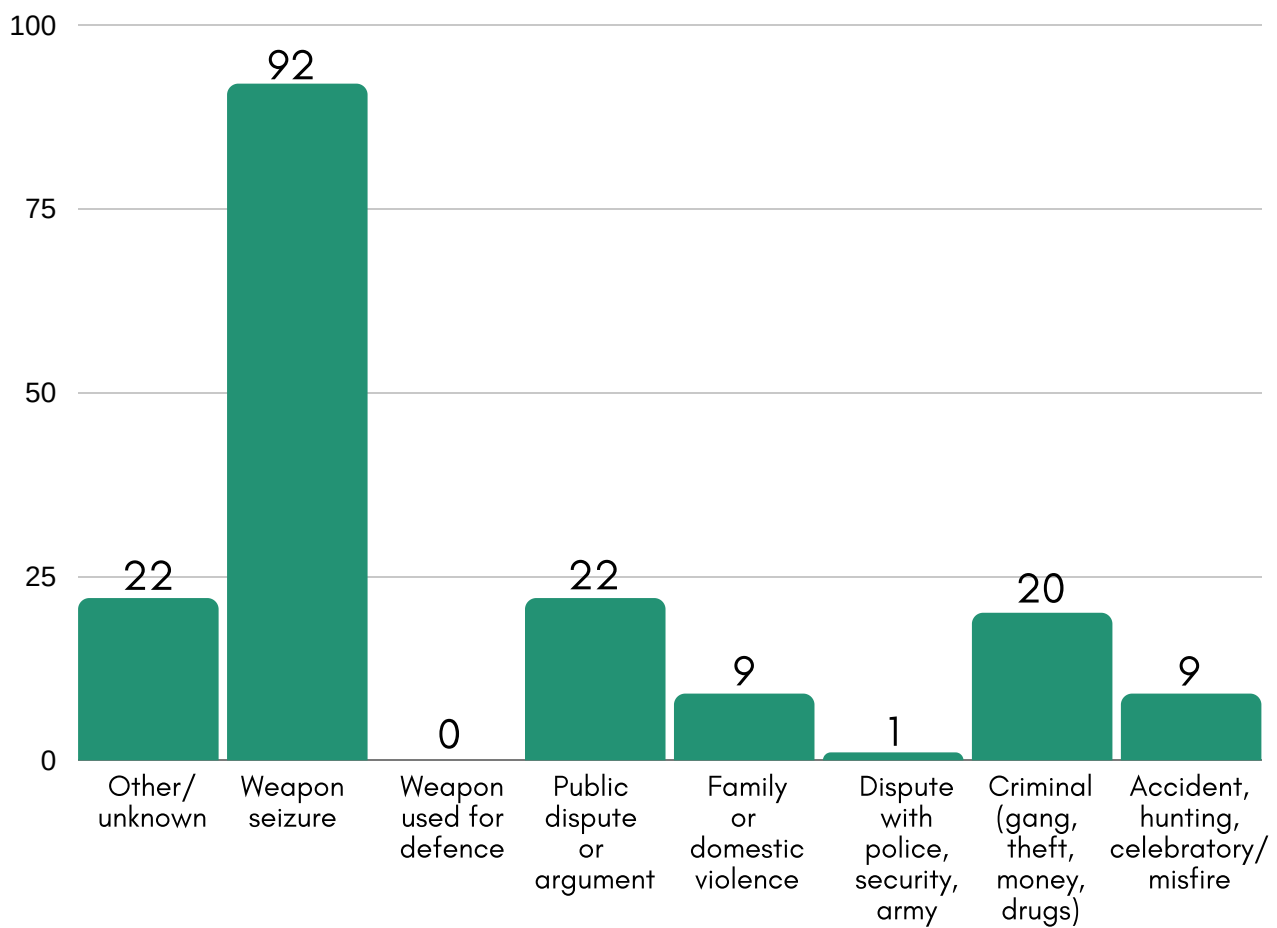
As per media clippings, a total of **175** firearm-related incidents that took place in the region were recorded on the AVMP.**



*References to Kosovo shall be understood to be in the context of Security Council Resolution 1244 (1999).

**The information provided in this report is based on the AVMP data extracted on 10 October 2019.

Types of incidents



Perpetrators

Total number of perpetrators was **197**, of whom **183** were men and **4** were women.*

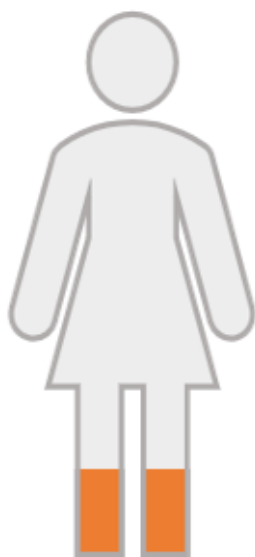

Victims

In all incidents in September, the total number of victims was **85**. In the incidents for which the sex of the victims was reported, **67** were men and **14** were women.

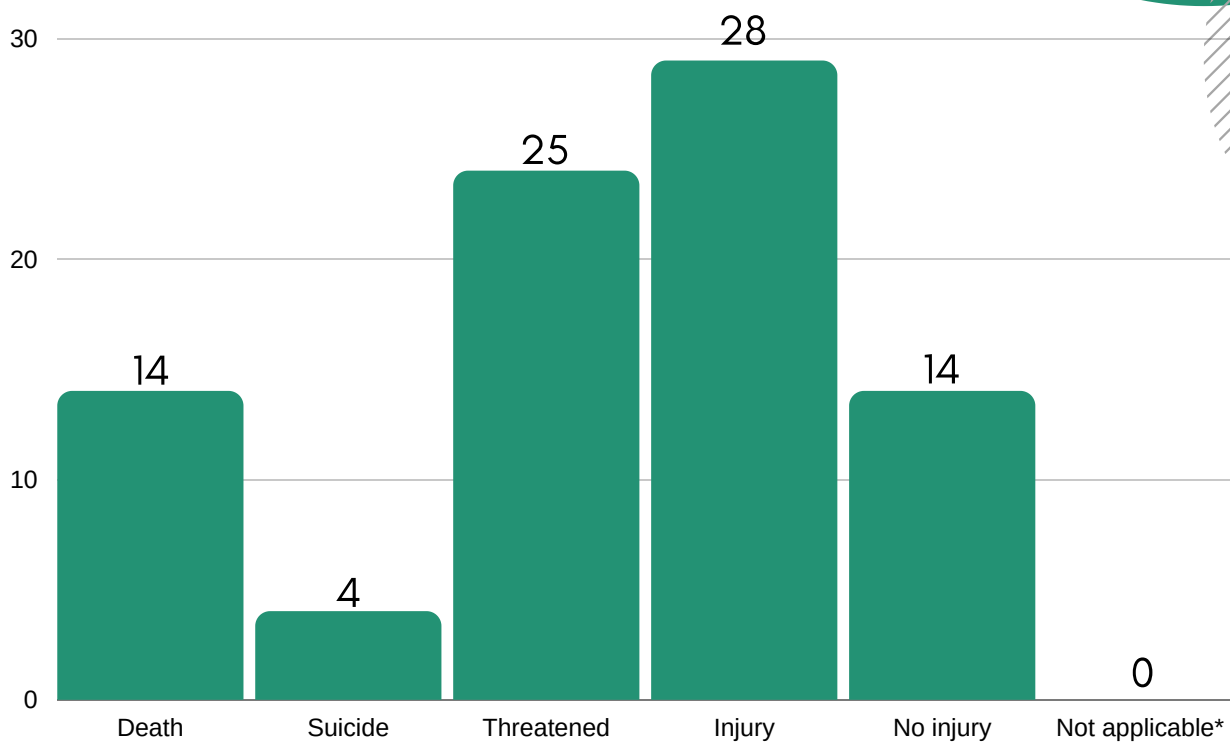

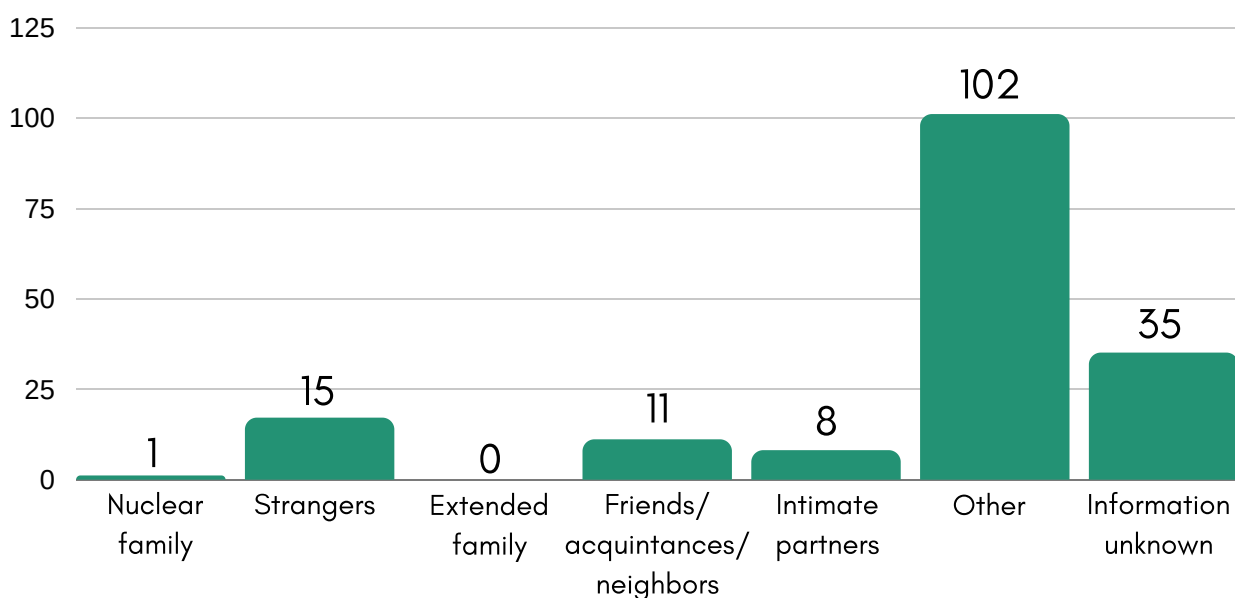
*Victim refers to any individual who has been threatened, injured or died as a result of the use of a firearm.

Outcome for Victims



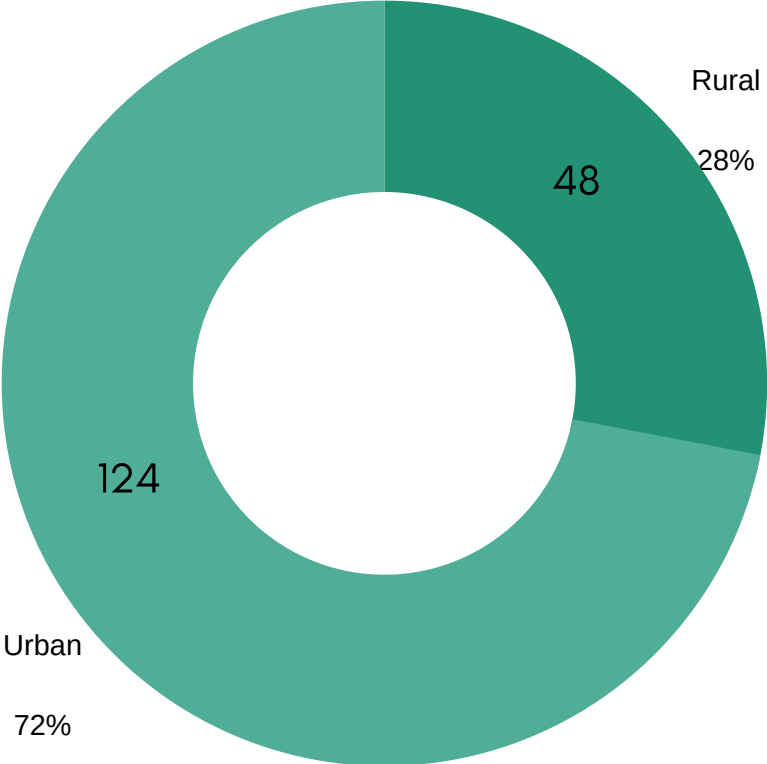
**Not applicable shall refer to all incidents where a firearm was present but was not discharged nor used for inflicting injuries and threatening (for example, a theft of a firearm).*

Relationship between victims and perpetrators



**Other refers to all relationships that cannot be classified under any of the above categories, as well as to weapons seizures, suicides, self-injury, non-hunting-related shooting of animals, etc.*
