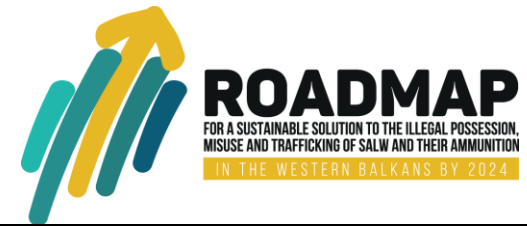

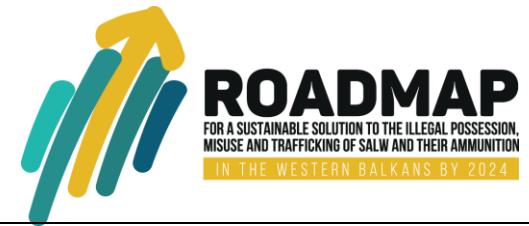

The CCP develops capability to profile, target and examine containers being used for the transport of illicit goods. At the very core of the Programme, is the creation of inter-agency Port Control Units (PCU) consisting of customs and law enforcement agencies. The PCUs are trained according to a specialized training methodology developed by the CCP. The trained officials will be part of the global network of container profilers linked in the WCO Container COMM information sharing system and will also participate in regional and international meetings and operational exercises. |
