Biannual progress reports

Biannual progress reports documenting the progress, challenges and needs in the Roadmap implementation, against the KPIs and its goals;

Starting from 2024, the KPIs Report is submitted annually, while the Roadmap narrative reports to be submitted every six months;

SALW Commissions

The SALW Commissions are responsible for collecting the required data and progress on activities as per Roadmap Goals, from all relevant institutions (except for KPI 5 and KPI 14);

SEESAC

SEESAC is integrating the data into a regional report that is shared regularly with the EU, other donors, regional and international partners;

EU COUNCIL

Supported through the EU Council Decisions 2018/1788 and 2022/2321.








- Main laws on <u>civil use of firearms and ammunition</u> remain reported as **partially** or **not harmonized**:
 - Amendments to the Law on weapons still pending adoption;
- Legislative framework on civil use of explosives and pyrotechnics yet to be harmonized;
- Working group to develop the Law on explosive precursors established;
- Amendments of the **Criminal Code** were adopted.



- SALW Commission in place coordinating and monitoring the SALW Control Strategy and Action Plan (2019-2025);
- Firearms Focal Point established and operational in data collection and analysis, preparation of intelligence reports on firearms-related crimes;
- Active participation in JAD operations, including the intelligence phase was reported;
- The accreditation of the **Ballistic Laboratory** completed.



- Assessment on the needs for Crime Scene Investigations reported, as well as harmonization of the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) of crime scene investigation units with ENFSI best practices;
- Regular exchange of information through Interpol's iARMS and Europol's SIENA;
- No unified information exchange system in place between police, prosecutor's office and courts; Limited data on KPI 3 and KPI 8.




- Improving detection capacities for border police reported, as well as participation in national and regional workshops and training;
- Adoption of the Standard Operating Procedures for Border Police was reported;
- Engagement and operational cooperation mostly with Interpol, Europol and EU member states was reported;
- No reported cases of diversion from legal trade of arms and ammunition;
- No cases of seizure at the border reported.

Cases of seized FAE






Quantity of seized firearms (pcs)

Quantity of seized ammunition (pcs)






- Limited activities related to awareness raising, outreach and education on the dangers and risks related to the misuse, illicit possession, and trafficking of firearms/SALW;
- Number of voluntary surrendered firearms and ammunition increased compared to the previous reporting period;
- No legalization of firearms reported since 2018;
- Five firearms deactivated in 2023;
- SEESAC's AVMP has captured increase in weapon seizures, representing 66% of all recorded incidents in the AVMP, as well as an increase in incidents in the criminal context, mainly those linked to organized crime.


Incidents committed with firearms


- A total of **510 incidents** involving firearms were reported in this period, showing a stark increase compared to 2022 (164)
- During the reporting period, the incidents involved **321 legal** and **189 illegal firearms**



KPI 10 Outcome of incidents

- Number of persons who committed the **suicide** with the firearms is on the increase;
- Number of deaths and injuries decresed.





- A total of 798 pieces of weapons were **destroyed** in 2023;
- Continued disposal of unexploded ordnance;
- Ad hoc inspections of relevant legal entities dealing with firearms reported;
- There were no weapons or ammunition reported as stolen or lost, by state institutions, private entities, or citizens;
- Support for the adaptation of the remaining buildings and storage facilities for the needs of the MoI and the MoD was requested.
