HIGH-LEVEL MEETING OF THE FRANCO-GERMAN COORDINATION INITIATIVE ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ROADMAP FOR COMPREHENSIVE SMALL ARMS AND LIGHT WEAPONS CONTROL IN THE WESTERN BALKANS

Berlin, 31 January 2020

Germany and France are co-organising the second high-level meeting of the Franco-German initiative for the comprehensive control of small arms and light weapons in the Western Balkans, which will be held in Berlin on 31 January 2020. This meeting will be co-chaired by the German Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs Heiko Maas, the French Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs Jean-Yves Le Drian, the European Commissioner for Home Affairs Ylva Johansson and the European Commissioner for Neighbourhood and Enlargement Olivér Várhelyi.

I. The venue – Federal Foreign Office

The conference will take place at the Federal Foreign Office. The entrance to the conference premises will be at Unterwasserstraße 10, 10117 Berlin.

Delegations (1+2) are made up of:

- Two accompanying officials (delegates)

The delegations will be accredited at the conference venue. All delegates entering the venue must identify themselves by providing an official identity document. Badges will be handed out at the accreditation desk which will be located in the conference area next to the entrance. Please make sure to wear badges visibly at all times.

III. Gallery Walk

In the morning between 9.00 and 10.00 and during the lunch break between 13.00 and 15.00, delegations will have the opportunity to visit the interactive Gallery Walk located in front of the main hall. Here, three pilot projects contributing to the goals of the Roadmap will be highlighted: the OSCE's contribution to arms control through deactivation of small arms and light weapons, UNDP SEESAC's Gender Coach Program as an example of best practice in Gender Responsive Firearms Control and UNDP CIAT's Countering illicit arms trafficking in Bosnia and Herzegovina.
