#### BACKGROUND

The Belgrade-based South East Europe Clearinghouse for the Control of Small Arms and Light Weapons (SEESAC), supported by UNDP and the Stability Pact, has continued to maintain close liaison and co-operation with the Serbian Ministry of the Interior during the current amnesty initiative.<sup>1</sup> The final SEESAC support provided for Phase 1 of the initiative was for the destruction of a limited quantity of small arms ammunition.



### AMMUNITION DESTRUCTION



On 16 April 2003 approximately 40,000 rounds of small arms ammunition were destroyed by burning in a small rotary kiln furnace at the *Prvi Partizan* ammunition facility in **Uzice**. SEESAC technical staff monitored the destruction. The destruction system at *Prvi Partizan* is only designed to destroy between 20 - 40,000 rounds per working day, (approximately 0.4 - 0.8 tonnes<sup>2</sup>), and does not have a logistic disposal capability.

SEESAC now intends to move on to Phase 2 of the process,

which will be to encourage further destruction operations for the remaining 42,000 weapons collected during the amnesty initiative.<sup>3</sup> This will involve negotiation with Ministry of Interior, co-ordination activities and resource mobilization with potential donors.
